Beech - Common beech is a large, deciduous tree, native to southern England and South Wales. Beech trees can live for hundreds of years and mature trees grow to a height of more than 40m and develop a huge domed crown. It usually grows on drier, free-draining soils, such as chalk, limestone and light loams. It requires a humid atmosphere and well-drained soil.

Hornbeam - Hornbeam is a deciduous broadleaf tree native to the south of the UK, but widely planted elsewhere. Mature trees can reach a height of 30m and live for more than 300 years. They like sand, chalk, loam or clay-type soils that are moist but well-drained.

Wild Cherry - Wild cherry is thought to be the most ornamental of our native broadleaf woodland trees. Mature trees can grow to 30m and live for up to 60 years. The shiny bark is a deep reddish-brown with prominent cream-coloured horizontal lines. It grows best in full sunlight and fertile soil..

Sessile oak - Sessile oak is a deciduous broadleaf tree native to the UK and most of Europe. The sessile oak is so-named because, unlike the English, or pedunculate oak, its acorns are not carried on stalks (peduncles) but directly on the outer twigs (sessile). It can grow up to 20-40m tall. Grows well in most deep, fertile soils.

Scots pine - Scots pine is an evergreen conifer native to northern Europe, and is one of just three conifers native to the UK. Mature trees grow to 35m and can live for up to 700 years. Grow in any well-drained soil.
